Artist Statement

Weaving is a process that has many intersections and connections. This medium resonates with me because of its ability to create layers of pattern and meaning across the planar surface. It is a very meditative process that allows for thoughts and feelings to become an integral part of the meaning within each woven work of art.

My work is inspired by my experiences, the people in my life, and memories. My pieces are abstract visual representations of my personal life and experiences including the people who are closest and most important to me. They can be compared to a writer who journals their deepest thoughts and feelings but expressed in a visual interpretation of line, color, pattern, and texture.

Artist Biography

Robin Haller is an Assistant Professor at East Carolina University, School of Art and Design, Textile Design Program, Greenville, NC, where she teaches weaving and felt making. Robin's weavings have been exhibited both nationally and internationally. She has received multiple grants to pursue her research in digital design and weaving, and has been the recipient of the **HGA Award** and two-time **Best of Show Award** in *Fiber Celebration*, Colorado, and *First Place Award* in *Handcrafted 2012*, North Carolina.
